# A message from our directors

Dear Friends and Supporters,

As we look back on 2025, we are filled with gratitude for the compassion and generosity that continues to power the mission of Little Lambs Foundation for Kids. This past year was extraordinary, made possible because people like you chose to stand with Utah's children and families when they needed it most.

In 2025, Little Lambs distributed over 2 million diapers, provided 4291 hygiene kits, and ensured babies across Utah could stay clean, dry, and healthy. More than 7,000 babies and 5,700 families received support through our Healthy Babies Diaper Program. Our Comfort Kit Program reached 1005 children entering foster care, offering dignity and comfort during incredibly difficult transitions.

We expanded support for teen parents and student families, hosted baby showers for expecting moms, and continued to build our Family Resource & Community Outreach efforts, helping families access both essential items and the education and stability needed for long-term success.

This year also marked a major milestone: meaningful progress on Phase 1 of our new Diaper Bank & Community Resource Center. With land secured, planning completed, and momentum growing, this future space will allow us to serve more families than ever before and create room for expanded volunteer engagement, classrooms, and wrap-around services.

Every diaper packed, every comfort kit delivered, every parent supported, these moments are at the heart of our mission. And each one is possible because of you. Whether you donated, volunteered, hosted a drive, or simply shared our mission, you played a vital role in changing lives across Utah.

As we step into a new year filled with opportunity, our commitment remains the same: to be a steady source of hope, dignity, and support for children and families. Thank you for believing in this work and helping build brighter beginnings for those we serve.

Our mission is to strengthen Utah families by providing essential items, education, and resources to break the cycle of poverty and create a brighter, more secure future for children and their families

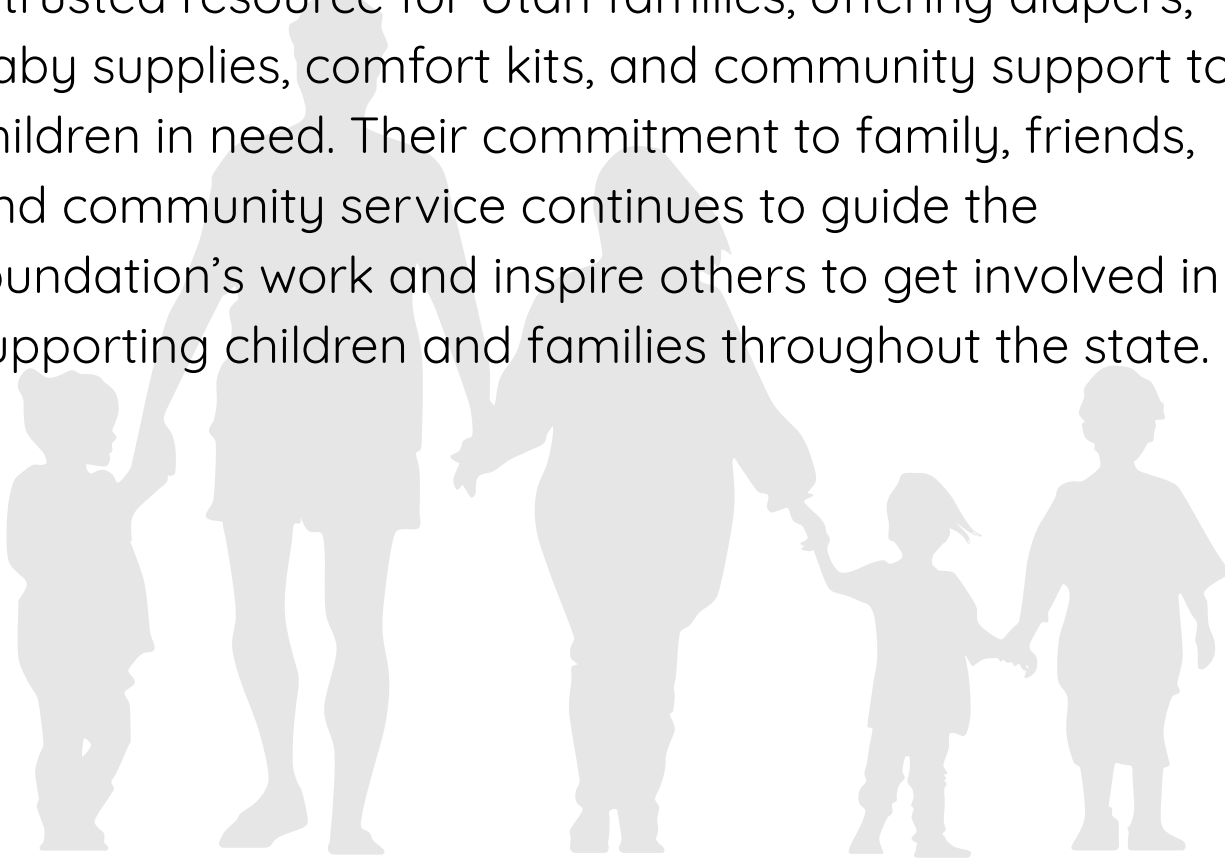


# OUR STORY

# Little Lambs Programs

## Diaper Assistance Program

The diaper assistance program at Little Lambs Foundation for Kids provides free diapers and basic baby necessities to families in need in the Logan area during scheduled assistance hours. The program meets immediate needs, supports child health and safety, and helps reduce financial stress on caregivers while maintaining a respectful, welcoming environment.

## Teen Parent Program

The teen parent program serves young parents by providing 100% of essential baby supplies as long as they remain enrolled in school, along with supportive resources that encourage healthy parenting and long-term self-sufficiency.

## Student Family Program

The student family program supports parents who are enrolled in school by providing essential baby items and resources to help reduce stress and promote family stability while they pursue their education.

## Comfort Kits

Comfort kits are distributed to DCFS offices across Utah and other partner organizations, providing children in foster care and similar situations with essential and comfort items to help them feel safe, valued, and supported during times of transition.

## Teen Ambassador Program

The teen ambassador program empowers youth to serve their community by volunteering at many of our events while building leadership, responsibility, and confidence.



# PROJECT LITTLE LAMBS



Project cost: \$1,530,000

We secured the land in September of 2025

To meet growing demand, Little Lambs Foundation for Kids is launching a capital campaign to build a 12,000 sq foot Diaper Bank & Community Resource Center that will expand access to diapers and essential items for families statewide.

This future facility will increase distribution capacity, strengthen community partnerships, and support long-term, sustainable impact for Utah families.

# 2025 Highlights



## Baby Showers

This year, Little Lambs hosted five baby showers for 84 moms. Each mom received a large item, like a car seat or playpen, plus baby clothes, bottles, diapers, wipes, and other essentials. With food, games, and giveaways, the events offered a fun, relaxing night. All gifts were generously donated by our community and partners.

## Student Clothing Event

Thanks to a generous donation of new clothes, we hosted a Moms Day Out. Moms in school could shop for clothes and makeup and pick up diapers. We loved supporting our student families!



## Mobile Distributions

This year, Little Lambs' Mobile van visited seven communities in Utah and Idaho, providing free diapers and wipes for up to two children per family. We're proud to bring support directly to rural and underserved families outside of Logan!

## Taste of Summer

Taste of Summer is our main fundraising dinner, supported by community donations. The event featured an online auction, speakers, a hypnotist, dinner, and live auction. Funds raised support our diaper and comfort kit programs and other essentials.





# 2025 Highlights



## Back to School Event

Our Back to School Event helps children start the year prepared with backpacks, supplies, and essentials. This year, we provided 822 children with school supplies, along with period products, pajamas, hygiene, books, and socks. It was all possible with the help of generous donors and volunteers!

## Community Distribution

Every year, our Community Distributions welcome any family in need to our Logan office. This October, families received coats, stuffed animals, diapers, wipes, period products, socks, and deodorant. We love supporting families in our program and across Cache Valley!



## Christmas Auction

Community donations for our online auction raised \$1,000 to fund our annual Christmas Party for foster families, helping make the event extra special for the kids!

## Foster Families Christmas Party

Our annual Christmas Party brings foster families together for a special holiday. This year, 170 kids received gifts, food, stuffed animals, books, and other surprises. Over 100 volunteers helped with Santa, games, face painting, henna, and visits from USU Cheer, Big Blue, and athletes. We loved creating Christmas magic for these families!

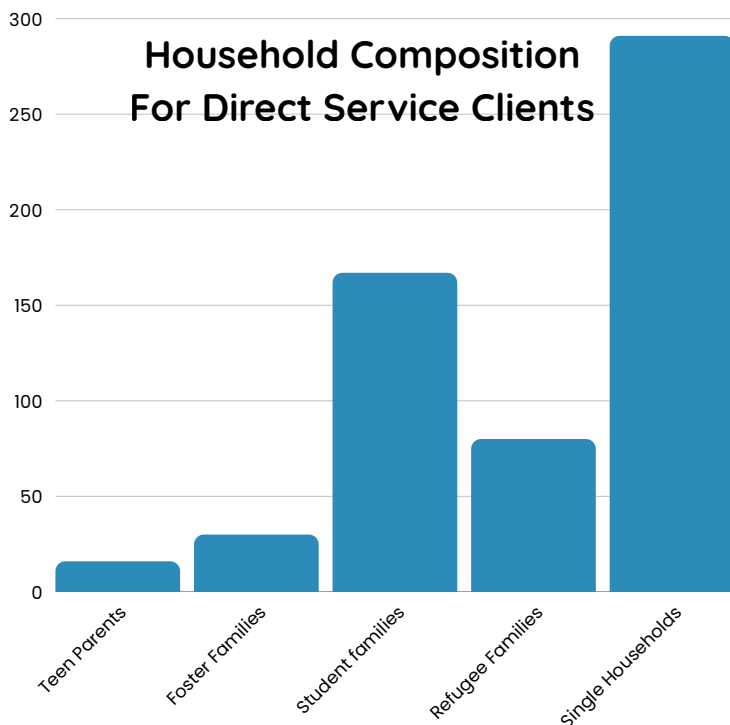

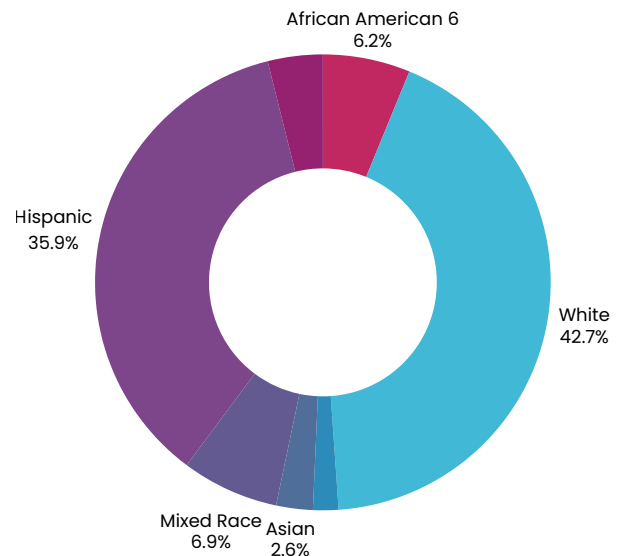

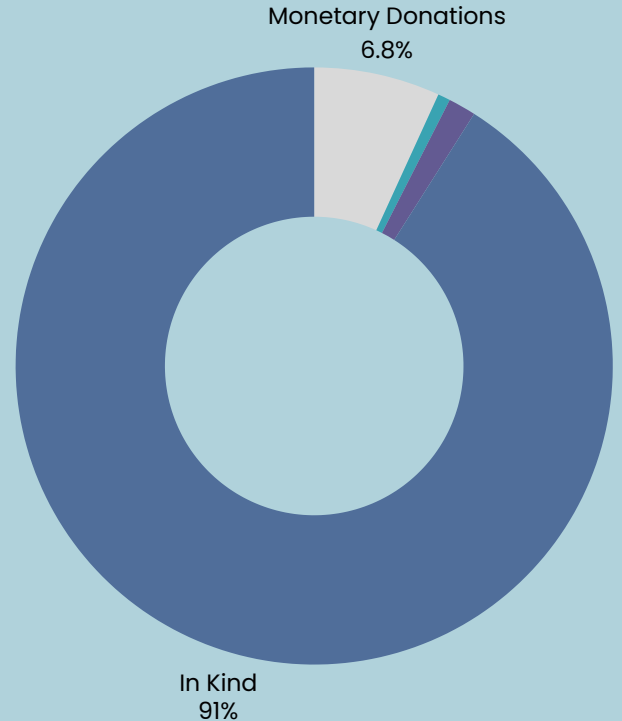

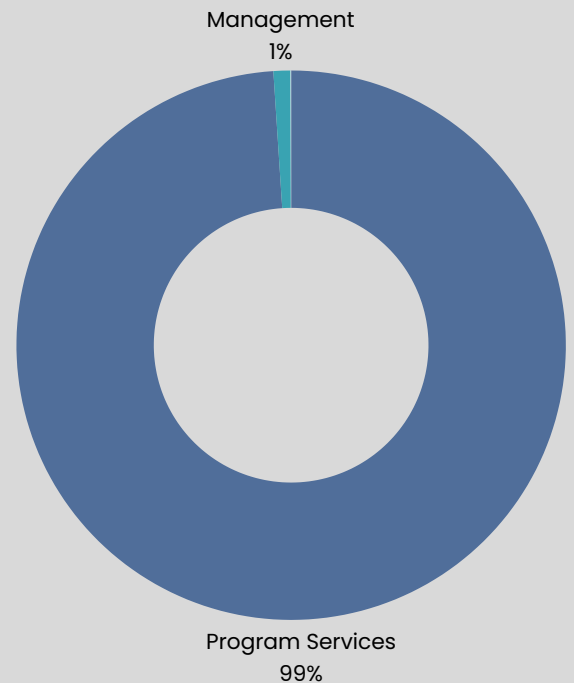
